Questions to ask your child

fiction

This is a story book with events that are imaginary, such as novels and short stories.

Ask during the story:

- ★ What do you think might happen next?
- What has happened so far? Is this what you expected to happen?
- What happened next?
- What sort of character is
- ★ How would you feel if that happened to you?

Ask at the end:

- What did you like about the story?
- What didn't you like about the story?
- Was there anything that puzzled you?
- ★ Did the story remind you of anything?

Non-fiction

This is a book of real facts

and information, such as an atlas,

reference book,

biography or dictionary.

Ask as you go along:

- What does this page tell you about ?
- ★ Is there anything that interests you on this page?

Ask when your child has finished:

- ★ What facts have you read?
- ★ Have you learnt anything new?
- ★ Where could you look to find information about _____?
- ★ Is there anything you would like to learn more about?
